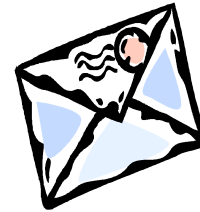

			<p>Back to work, Back to class forms and Monitoring sheets record a student's behaviour and help them to return to and follow 'Our values'. Catch ups, and Time outs are used for staff to talk through problems and behaviour with students and for relationships to be repaired.</p> <p>If poor behaviour continues, parents/carers are contacted to discuss higher levels of sanctions (detention, isolation, and how they can support the school and their child).</p>

Parents/Carers Responsibility

We expect parents/carers to:

- support our school by ensuring your child upholds Our Values.
- ensure your child is prepared for school, wearing the correct uniform and equipped for lessons.
- ensure your child attends school and provide a reason for any absence they may have.
- support your child and school by attending parents evenings and annual reviews.
- help your child and school, in the event of breaches of Our Values or the Code of Conduct, by attending meetings and supporting any behaviour learning strategies put in place.
- supply school with **two** emergency contact numbers and to update this information when necessary.
- supply school with current & relevant medication for your child should they require taking it during school hours.
- discourage your child bringing valuable or electrical items to school. If your child brings a mobile phone to school, encourage them to hand it in to the office at the start of school. (Southall will not be responsible for the loss of any such items if looked after by your child)

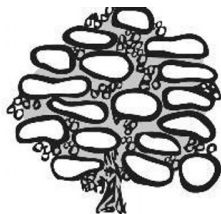
